Rising over Manhattan's premier shopping and business district between Park and Madison Avenues, this architectural icon features stunning views and boasts a gracious style. Numerous property upgrades in recent years include a redesigned spa and fitness center, the addition of TY Lounge and The Garden Restaurant, two Presidential Suites, the Royal Suite, and the crown jewel – the Ty Warner Penthouse Suite.
