

The St. Regis New York

BUILT IN 1904 BY JOHN JACOB ASTOR, The St. Regis New York is a beloved Beaux Arts landmark and is considered one of the top hotels in the world, having received the Mobil Five-Star Award for the 15th consecutive year in 2009. Situated in the heart of midtown Manhattan, The St. Regis New York is within walking distance of Central Park, Fifth Avenue shopping, excellent restaurants, and first-rate theater.

Recently redesigned, the property offers 229 luxurious guest rooms and suites, featuring Louis XVI-style furniture, crystal chandeliers, carved crown moldings and wainscoting, marble baths, and silk wall coverings. Guests looking to indulge during their stay have the option of the two-bedroom 1,700-square-foot Bottega Veneta Suite or the \$19,000-per-night 3,500-square-foot threebedroom Presidential Suite, both offering elegant views of Fifth Avenue.

Inside the hotel, guests can condition with a personal trainer at the fitness center or relax and regroup at The Spa by St. Regis. Each floor of the hotel has a butler service to meet each guest's needs.

There is no shortage of wonderful dining venues to choose from, including the King Cole Bar, which boasts a Maxfield Parrish art nouveau masterpiece; Astor Court, where guests can enjoy afternoon tea; or Adour, the hotel's new signature restaurant by internationally acclaimed chef, Alain Ducasse. In terms of meeting and event space, vaulted, cloud-dappled ceilings hung with gilt chandeliers set an elegant tone for corporate and social affairs. The property boasts 15,000 square feet of space in 15 venues, and the largest space accommodates up to 200.
