



Guests of Falling Rock may choose a King or Queen suite, one of only four available, each with a dining balcony overlooking the Infinity Pool and the 18th green of Mystic Rock. Suites include a spacious living room with a sofa sleeper and gas fireplace, as well as flat-screen televisions where TV sound is piped into the bathroom. The 24-hour complimentary butler service includes morning wake-up service, the ironing of clothes and shining of shoes, the packing and unpacking of bags, and the option to have an evening bath drawn with or without bubbles in a 210-gallon soaking tub, which includes flower petals and candles set up throughout the bathroom. Visitors will also appreciate a 10-choice pillow menu, a room with either one king bed or two queen beds made up with 1,200-thread-count Egyptian cotton sheets and a hand-sewn chenille duvet cover, and nightly turn-down service with complimentary amenity. ●
